

### Community Policing Act Training

The objective of this course is to ensure the accurate reporting of investigatory stop data, as required under Chapter 6.1 of the Virginia Community Policing Act, to the Virginia Department of State Police. Instruction covers the definition and scope of an investigatory detention, when and how stop data must be reported, and detailed guidance on each required data field. Participants will receive quality-control tips and training materials to help agencies review stop data before uploading it to the online repository. Students will also learn how to access Community Policing stop-data reports in the VA Crime Online Reporting Site for quality-control review and analysis.

### VA Crime Online Repository & Reporting Site (Beyond 20/20)

This interactive training introduces participants to the Virginia Crime Online Reporting Site (Beyond 20/20), maintained by the Virginia State Police, and its role in supporting accurate crime-data reporting. The course explains the purpose of the Virginia Crime Repository, outlines the history of key data collections (VA Incident-Based Reporting, Community Policing Act Stop Data, and Use of Force–Officer-Involved Shooting), and clarifies what information is included in each dataset.

The session covers both the public and LEA reporting portals and gives students hands-on experience navigating standardized reports, creating custom reports, manipulating tables, and exporting data. Because of the interactive format, participants are strongly encouraged to bring a laptop.

### Incident Based Reporting (IBR) Training

The objective of this course is to ensure the accurate reporting of Incident-Based Reporting (IBR) crime data to the Virginia Department of State Police. In addition to improving reporting accuracy, the course is designed to help agencies develop strong proficiency in entering case information, understanding the IBR reporting system, and effectively using the data they submit.
